### Gift Aid Declaration

Gift Aid makes an enormous difference to us and does not cost the donor anything extra. For every pound donated we can reclaim 28% (based on tax year 2008/09) from the Inland Revenue. This means that a £100 donation made under Gift Aid is worth £128 to us. In addition donors who are higher-rate taxpayers are able to claim personal tax relief on the difference between the higher rate of tax and the basic rate in their Self Assessment Return - worth 25 pence for every pound donated. Gift Aid can apply to donations of any amount, large or small, made by cash, cheque, standing order, debit or credit card.

To make a Gift Aid donation, you need to have paid enough tax in the UK to cover the amount reclaimed by Cambridge, and to sign and return the Gift Aid Declaration below.

#### Notes

1. You must pay an amount of income tax and/ or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that The Cambridge Foundation reclaims on your donations in the tax year.

4. If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief in your Self-Assessment tax return.
